St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara
Our Patron Saint & Inspiration

St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara was born on 10th February 1805 at Kainakary, Kerala. At the age of five he began his studies in a village school, known as 'Kalari'. When he was 13, he joined the seminary at Pallipuram for his priestly training. While he was in the seminary, his parents and his eldest brother died in a epidemic. On 29th November 1829, he was ordained a priest,

St. Chavara was instrumental in founding two Catholic Religion Congregations one for men, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), and the other for women, Congregation of Mother of Carmel (CMC), for the spiritual renewal and all round development of the society.

Establishing seven ashrams and a convent in different parts of Kerala, Chavara initiated a spiritual movement among the people of Kerala. He established the first Catholic Sanskrit School, a major seminary and a printing and publishing house at Mannanam. He directed that every church should start a school attached to it and encouraged children from even poor families to attend the schools by supplying midday meals and clothes to wear. He founded a 'Home of Charity' to take care of destitute, the beggars, the uncared sick and the old. He also

organized the first voluntary charitable association in Kerala for self-help among the needy.

Even in the midst of such manifold activities, he found times to write several literary and spiritual book in prose as well as verse. Among them, 'Anastasyayude Rakthasakshyam' is the first narrative poem and 'Nalagamangal' the first chronicle of history in Malayalam. He knew seven languages- Malayalam, Tamil, Sanskrit, Syriac, Latin, Italian and Portuguese.

Essentially, however, St. Chavara was a man of piety and great charity. He lived for 65 years and died on 3rd January 1986. His sanctity was officially recognized by the church, when Pope John Paul II declared him 'Blessed' on 8th February 1986. Blessed Chavara 'Deo Volente' was canonized in 23rd November 2014 by Pope Francis.

St. Chavara is the heavenly patron of all CMI and CMC institutions. Let us pray to him to intercede before God for all our needs, especially for success in our academic endeavours.

The celestial symphony of the sound and spirit of our founder, St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara is the inspiration that ever accelerated the onward march of the KE College that remain a flagship service in the academic perfection for the modern youth today. KE College symbolizes its Master's voice. "I am the truth, the way and the life".



#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Kuriakose Elias College was established and is administered by St. Joseph's Monastery, Mannanam, the Mother House of the CMI Congregation. The College is built on the same beautiful hill where in 1846, Saint Kuriakose Elias took the first step towards secular education by starting the "Sanskrit School". It was here in Mannanam that the first press of the Catholic Church in India (third in the state of Kerala) came up. This was also the place which saw the publication of the first Malayalam daily (Nazrani Deepika) in 1887. The first English medium school of the Catholics in Kerala was started here in 1881. St. Ephrem's High School, one of the first high schools in Kerala came up here in Mannanam, in 1885. Mannanam thus has made solid contributions to the cultural, educational and spiritual spheres right from the inception of the CMI congregation in 1831.

K.E. College was established in 1964 as a Junior College to give the catholic youth, the benefits of higher education through a congenial catholic environment. The college fulfills this aim, working hand in hand with the Government and University and giving due respect to the rights of the minorities guaranteed by the Constitution of India. Rev. Fr. Fabian CMI, the Prior of St. Joseph's Monastery was the Founder Manager and inspirational force behind the construction of the college building. Rev. Fr. Papias CMI was the first Principal of the college. The college was affiliated to Kerala University and upgraded as a Degree college in 1967. Since 1983, the college has been under the jurisdiction of Mahatma Gandhi University. In the short span of fifty seven years, the college has become a great centre of leaming and a source of inspiration to the people of Kerala.

#### **Aims and Objectives**

The Congregation of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate undertakes educational apostolate, based on the love of God and service to mankind as modelled in Jesus Christ, against the background of Indian heritage so as to produce intellectually competent, morally upright, socially committed and spiritually inspired men and women of India. In pursuance of the above



general objective of education, the college has been redefining its objectives from time to time. Today the college stands for the following objectives:

- To create a just and humane society where dignity of the human person is respected, where unjust social structures are challenged, where our cultural heritage of Ahimsa, Religious Harmony and National Integration are upheld and where the poor and the marginalized are specially taken care of.
- ➡ To form leaders who are intellectually competent, spiritually mature, morally upright, psychologically integrated, physically healthy and socially acceptable, who will champion the cause of justice, love and peace.
- To promote the acquisition of scholarship and communicative skills by involving the students in research oriented projects and co-curricular activities.
- To prepare the youth of the 21<sup>st</sup> century by promoting international brotherhood, environmental consciousness, gender justice and the sense of humanity.

For the accomplishment of the above goals, the College is putting in special efforts to enable the students to strive for excellence in every field, to seek and apply knowledge to find solutions to various social problems, to value and use their freedom with responsibility, to be clear and firm on principles and values and to be selfless in rendering services, through a team of teachers who are active, dedicated, competent and humane in dealings.

#### **Management**

The College is managed by the St. Joseph's Monastery, Mannanam, the Mother House of CMI Congregation and comes under the purview of the Chapter and the Education Committee of the Monastery. The Prior of St. Joseph's Monastery is the Manager. The general management of the college is vested in the Managing Board whose Ex-officio President is the Manager. Other members are appointed by the Manager in accordance with the bye-law of the Managing Board.

#### 1. DISCIPLINE

#### A. Strict Observation of College Rules

The Principal is the ultimate disciplinary authority in the college.

Students should strictly follow the disciplinary rules of the college. A student is not expected to plead that he/she is not aware of the existence of such rules. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. Students are to read the college notice board daily. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/herself with decency and decorum. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including suspension, or dismissal.

#### **B.** Outsiders not Permitted

- Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the members of the staff or students on the college campus without the permission of the HOD and Principal.
- ii. Students shall not bring any press reporters and media persons to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the HOD/Principal.
- iii. Only parents/guardians are permitted.

#### C. Mobile Phones Banned

Students are not allowed to use the mobile phones on the college campus as per the Government order (GO. No. RT/ No.346/5 Higher Edn. dated 01-03-2005). Those who are found to be in violation of this rule will have to face the consequences of their mobile phones confiscated and fines levied.



#### D. Character and Conduct

Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by a student's good conduct and behaviour. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter, and will not be based on any recommendation. The following are the rules and regulations.

- I. Political activities on the part of students and the members of staff are strictly forbidden on the college campus.
- II. Any meeting of the faculty, staff or students on the college campus shall be arranged only with the explicit permission of the college authorities.
- III. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the Principal is entitled to refuse admission to an applicant, to suspend, dismiss or take any other punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct.
- IV. Misconduct shall include:
- a. Staying away from classes without sufficient reason.
- b. Disrespectful behaviour towards the members of the staff.
- c. Provoking students to strike and participate in strike, dharna etc. in the college.
- d. Loitering in and around the main gate, porch, stairs and the verandas during freehours and creating disturbance to the classes in progress. (During free hours the students are expected to make use of the library or go to the retiring rooms.)
- e. Disorderly behaviour in the class.
- f. Organizing tours without the permission of the Principal
- g. Organizing meetings in the college or displaying notices on the college notice board without the permission of the Principal.
- h. Distributing leaflets, hand-bills or other materials and



displaying banners and posters inside the campus.

- Scribbling offensive, abusive or obscene words or drawing figures on black boards or any kind of writings on the walls or other places in the college or on the campus.
- v. Smoking, consumption of alcoholic beverages and use of narcotic drugs are strictly prohibited. Criminal proceedings will be taken against those found under the influence of alcohol or narcotic drugs within the campus.
- vi. Vandalism and destruction of college property will be severely dealt with and the material loss will be fully recovered with fine.
- vii. When the students meet a member of the staff within the campus or outside, they will greet him/her as a mark of respect.
- viii. Students are expected to keep decency and decorum in their dress and behaviour. Pictures and writings of any sort shall not be exhibited on the dress.
- ix. These rules are liable to be amended when found necessary.
- x. The teachers shall be present in the class before the third bell so that they may give good example to the students by participating in prayer.
- xi. Teachers shall be responsible for maintaining discipline in classes.
- xii. It is the duty of the students and the staff to get informed of all the rules and notifications of the college from time to time. Ignorance of these rules is not condoned.
- xiii. The properties of the college must be handled with utmost care by the students. Any impairment cost to any of the furniture and other items will be deleted with by the imposition of fines and penal actions.



- xiv. The vehicles of the students must only be parked in areas designated to them for that purpose.
- xv. Students should not wander in the campus or engage in group activities while standing on the varandas.

#### E. Mandatory Dress Code

There is prescribed uniform for the aided and unaided students. On monday & wednesday students are expected to wear descent dresses while on the College campus. Gents should restrain from using the outfits such as low waist pants, collarless T- shirts and outlandish jewellery. Ladies should avoid putting on high slits for Kameezes, sleeveless tops, leggings, short kurtis and so on so forth. If any student is in violation of the above mentioned dress code, he/she will be asked to vacate the campus and his/her attendance is cancelled out. When the students of the K.E. College represent it on various platforms outside of it they must follow the college prescribed dress code.

#### F. Identity Card Compulsory

Students should wear at all times college identification cards which should be shown to the authorities and to the security guard when demanded. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc. and entry into college premises including principal's room, staff room, class rooms, examination halls, library, auditorium, laboratories, open air auditorium will be made only on production of the Identity Card. The Identity Card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificates, whichever is earlier. Class teachers may see to it that students comply with this.



#### G. Religious and Moral Instructions

All catholic students are to attend the Holy Mass in the College Chapel on the first Friday of every month. Non Catholic students must compulsory attend the moral classes to be held simultaneously in the college auditorium.

# H. Cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted on the campus.

#### I. Ragging: A Serious Criminal Offence

The act of ragging is considered as a criminal offence and it is firmly prohibited on the campus as per the Govt. Notification No 16992/Leg. BI/98/Law Dated. 24-06-1998. Those students who indulged in this most despicable and objectionable practice will have to face the actions of the severest kind as per the provisions of the Ragging Prohibition Act, 1998.

#### **Provisions in the Ragging Prohibition Act, 1998**

# 2. GUIDELINES TO PREVENT SEXUAL HARASSMENT AGAINST WOMEN IN THE COLLEGE-POLICY AND PROCEDURE

- The girl students enjoy equal rights and status with boys in the college.
- ii. To protect the necessary privacy of girl students, a separate waiting room cum lunch hall with sufficient toilet facility is provided in the college. A quadrangle specifically for girls is provided in the campus and a separate room is provided for girls in the college canteen.
- iii. Male students are not permitted to the areas specified exclusively for girls.
- iv. Sexual harassment of any sort shall not be tolerated. The sexual harassment is defined as the request for sexual favours and other verbal (including written and electronic communications) or physical contact of a sexual nature.
- v. The Management, the Principal and the teaching staff should interact with girl students and take them into confidence by apprising them of their rights and safety in the college.
- vi. The institution has constituted a discipline committee consisting of senior faculty members to (a) keep a continuous watch and vigil against any violation of the guidelines and (b) to promptly deal with incidents of violation of the guidelines.
- vii. Any violation of the guidelines for the protection of girls shall be reported to the Principal or the discipline committee. The relevant telephone numbers are available in the college handbook.
- viii. If any violation of the guidelines is observed, the discipline committee after proper enquiry, will report the matter to the Principal.



- ix. The name of the offenders will be published on the notice board. Disciplinary action including expulsion, suspension, imposition of fines and public apology may be meted out to the offender.
- x. These guidelines are published in the college hand book as per the instruction from the UGC and are always guided by the best of intention and correctional attitude.

#### 3. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- A working day is divided into two sessions: the forenoon session (FN) of 3 periods and the afternoon session (AN) of 2 periods on I, II & IV days and 3 periods on III & IV days.
- Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period by the member of the teaching staff in charge of the class.
- iii. Students shall occupy their respective seats before attendance is taken. Latecomers should not enter the class room, nor should any student leave the class room, without the permission of the member of the teaching staff in charge ofthe class.
- iv. Latecomers may be refused attendance for the period or marked late at the discretion of the lecturer concerned.
- v. Those students going for sports, games, competitions or official purposes of the union activities etc. should apply for prior permission from the Principal on the prescribed form, countersigned by the Head of the Department or teacher concerned in order to be eligible for leave. Non-compliance will be considered absence from class.
- vi. The Semester wise certificate of attendance and progress required by the University for promotion or for admission to the University Examination will, in no



- case be granted unless (i) a student has attended not less than three fourths of the number of working days for his/her course during the academic year, and (ii) the Principal is satisfied that the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
- vii. No student shall absent himself/herself from class without leave. Application for leave of absence should be made to the Principal, through the class teacher, in the prescribed form not later than the first date of return to the college after the absence.
- viii. Every application for leave shall be countersigned by the Parent or Guardian as the case may be. Incomplete application will be rejected.
- ix. When leave is required in case of illness, for more than three consecutive working days, application for the same must be supported by a Medical Certificate.
- x. If absent without leave for one period, a student will lose attendance for the whole session. When the total days of absence in a Semester exceed five, the parent/guardian of the student shall meet the Principal and give satisfactory explanation. This has to be followed for every five days of absence.
- xi. A student absenting himself/herself without leave for more than ten consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the roll, and he/she may be readmitted only on payment of the admission fee of ₹ 2/- and the College fee dues, if any.
- xii. Absence without leave from any terminal or class examination or from a composition or practical work will be taken seriously.
- xiii. Students should get 75% of attendance in a semester and the deficiency will be condoned only when the University Syndicate is satisfied that the absence was



for reasons beyond the control of the student. Deficiency beyond 10 days will, on no account, be condoned and exemption will not be granted for more than two semesters in any course of study.

### 4. PAYMENT OF FEES

- Fees are to be paid in three equal instalments (or in one lot for the full year). Special fees will be collected along with the first instalment.
- ii. If a student fails to pay the fee on the due date, he/she shall pay a fine of ₹ 5/- along with the fee on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day after the due date; if the I0<sup>th</sup> day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be considered as the 10<sup>th</sup> day.
- iii. If the fees and fines are not paid before the last opportunity given for payment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student will not get the benefit of at tendance from the date of removal from the rolls ofthe college. If the student is to be readmitted, he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also remit all arrears of fees with fine. No readmission fee will be realised in such cases of readmission. The readmitted student will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of readmission.
- iv. If the fee payment date happens to be a holiday, the fee should be remitted on the next working day.
- v. If a student studying in an Arts or Science College leaves with a T.C. and is admitted to another similar college, he/ she shall pay the fees for the term only in one college. He/she should produce the receipts and certificate of remittance obtained from the college which he/she has left, at the college where he/she is admitted. However, special fees and caution deposit will have to be paid again



- at the new college. The above mentioned provisions are applicable in the case of this college, with regard to inter college transfer.
- vi. Absence with or without leave from the College shall not be an excuse for non-payment of fees at the proper date.
- vii. No part payment will be accepted. Remember, the fees are to be remitted to the Government Treasury on the prescribed date.
- viii. Students who are admitted for a term for making up shortage of attendance for the course which the student was undergoing, should pay one third of the tuition fees for the year together with full fees and caution deposit at the time of admission. Only the former students of this college will be admitted as term students.
- ix. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are bonafide subjects of Kerala State are eligible for full fee concession and stipend. They will have to produce a certificate of nativity and community from a Revenue Officer not below the rank of a Thahsildar.
- x. On the days fixed for the payment of fees for a particular class, fees from other classes will not be accepted.
- xi. All cash transactions will be closed at 2.00 p.m.
- xii. Filing of application for the End-Semester Examination by the students is allowed only after the settlement of all the outstanding dues to the college.

### A. Caution Deposit

- Caution Deposit after deduction of dues, if any, will be refunded on the completion of the course of study or when the student leaves the college with a Transfer Certificate.
- ii. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of his/her caution deposit in time.



- iii. Claim for refund of caution deposit should be made before the opening of the college after the completion of the course. Amounts that remain unclaimed after two months from the date of the course completion will be forfeited.
- iv. The students should keep in safe custody the receipts issued for remittance of the caution deposit and it should be produced along with the application for refund of the caution deposit. Failure to produce the original receipt is forfeiture of the claim for the refund.

### 5. ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

- i. A student who has paid all dues to the College is entitled to a Transfer Certificate (T.C.) at the end of an academic year or when he/she leaves the college for better courses of study, and if the progress and conduct are good or satisfactory, as stipulated by University regulations.
- ii. A student past or present, desiring to obtain a certificate (Transfer, Course & Conduct, Age, Marks, and Identification etc.) shall apply to the Principal in writing stating the year of study and the class number.
- iii. In case a student is expelled from the college for serious misconduct or repeated misbehaviour, his/her T.C. will be sent to the Registrar of the University and the matter will be reported to his/her parent or quardian.
- iv. Every student should collect his/her T.C. at the end of his/her course and produce it when admitted to the next



- course. T. C. will be issued only against the surrender of the identity card.
- v. Conduct Certificate is a document which a student has to earn. It is not issued as a matter of right. Conduct Certificate is issued on the basis of an overall evaluation by the teachers concerned.

### 6. INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS

- There will be internal examinations in each semester.
- ii. 20% of the grade/mark will be awarded by the respective department, regarding a student's academic progress and this will be incorporated in the final mark/grade sheet issued by the University.
- iii. After each examination, parents will be asked to come to the department concerned, when informed and enquire of their ward's progress.
- iv. Students are not allowed to absent themselves from exams, test papers, seminars and internal assignments.

### 7. INTERNAL EVALUATION

The restructured curriculum for Degree and P. G. Courses in M. G. University has incorporated internal assessment as an effective measure for fruitful evaluation of students. The performance of every student in the campus, in addition to the evaluation through Internal Examinations, will be assessed in each semester by his/her teachers in accordance with the norms issued by the University. The marks awarded to the students in the internal assessment will be forwarded to the University for inclusion in the final mark sheet.

25% of evaluation is earmarked for Internal Evaluation of each PG. course and 20% for each UG course.

The internal assessment marks are determined on the basis of the class attendance as well. Students (UG & PG) who have not secured 75% attendance are not eligible to register for the University Examinations and will not be promoted to the next semester.

### 8. GRIEVANCES REDRESSAL MECHANISM

A Grievances Redressal cell functions in the college, in order to settle the grievances of students. It is a three tier system which functions in the following way.

- Tier 1 Class Teacher
- Tier 2 Head of the Department
- Tier 3 Principal / Principal in consultation with College Council.

Any matter of complaint/act of indiscipline of a student, shall be first brought to the notice of the class teacher



concerned and if the student/complainant is denied justice, he/she shall approach the HOD. If justice is denied there also, the matter shall be brought to the notice of the Principal and settled by him.

### 9. EXCURSION AND STUDY TOURS

Excursion and study tours by students are permitted as part of the curricular and co-curricular programme, under the following stipulations.

- Only final year students are allowed to organise study tour/ excursions.
- ii. This should be done only with the prior permission of the class teacher, Head of the Dept. concerned and the Principal. Students are to obtain letters of consent from their parent/s
- iii. Booking of vehicles and arrangements for stay while on tour should be made only after consultation with the concerned authorities.
- iv. Class Teacher(s) or other teachers deputed by the respective Head of the Dept. should accompany the students.
- v. The maximum number of days for a tour shall be four. However, for Zoology, Botany and Chemistry students, the number of days shall be fixed by the respective departments.
- vi. Any act of indiscipline while on tour shall be considered an act of indiscipline committed on the campus and will attract punitive action.
- vii. As far as possible, study tours shall be conducted during November/December soon after the semester examinations.
- viii.Each member of the touring party should see that his / her conduct enhances the prestige and reputation of the institution.



### 10. COLLEGE LIBRARY RULES

- i. All students are members of the College Library.
- ii. General Library timings: 8:30 am 4:30 pm

### **Class Days:**

Periodicals and Reference section: 8.30 a.m. to 3.30 pm Selection, Issue & Return of Books: 8.30 a.m. to 12.00 noon, 1.00 pm- 3.30 pm.

### **Non-class Days:**

Periodicals and Reference section:

9.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. Issue and Return of Books: 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon.

- iii. Silence must be strictly observed in the library.
- iv. Students may freely select books from the shelves. But they should be careful in replacing the books so that the books are not misplaced. In case of any difficulty, the books may be laid fiat on the shelves. Please remember misplaced books cannot be easily traced out.
- v. Students are allowed to take only one note book into the library.
- vi. Other books, umbrellas and other personal belongings should be kept in the shelves for personal effects at the entrance. Students will be permitted to take two books on loan at a time. Books in the Reference Section will not be lent out.
- vii. Students will be responsible for any damage caused to books. Pencil marks, ink-stain etc. made in a book will be treated as damage. When a book is issued to a student, he/she may point out to the librarian or his assistants any damage/defect noted concerning a book; otherwise it will be presumed that the book was intact when it was issued.



- viii. If a book is damaged or lost by a student he/she will have to replace it or pay three times of the cost of the book.
- ix. The period of loan is 14 days. Books may be re-issued for a further period of 14 days if there is no other demand for them. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for delay in the return of books. The librarian may recall any book at any time even before the due date.
- x. Failure to return book on the due date entails a student to pay a fine of ₹ 1.00 per day of delay except for intervening Sundays and public holidays.
- xi. Each student will be issued two Reader's Tickets. Books can be borrowed against them. Students must ensure that they get back their reader's tickets when they return the books. A sum of ₹ 25.00 will be charged for the loss of each Reader's Ticket. This does not, however, absolve the holder from the responsibility for books borrowed against tickets lost. Duplicates may be issued 15 days after the report of the loss.
- xii. Students are required to return all library books before 31st March every year. Final year students shall return their tickets also by that date. Defaulters will be charged the cost of books and a fine of ₹ 1.00 per day per item for the entire period of delay.
- xiii. Students shall not exchange books borrowed from the library.
- xiv. Students coming to the library, should show if demanded, their Identity Cards to the staff. Without Identity Cards library service will be refused to them.
- xv. As our library is fully computerised, students have to swipe their ID cards at the entry point, if they are to enter the library.

## Honorable High Court judgement in case No. 1806 of 2017 dtd 19-10-2017 filed by Kuriakose Elias College, Mannanam

Educational Institutions cannot be turned into a political battle ground. In an educational institution, there cannot be politics. Any individual student interested in politics is free to indulge in his interest, but outside the educational institution. These institutions are teaching and learning institutions. The police would be duty bound to give all assistance in the matter so that upon timely interventions, the Dharanas and vandalism is put under control.

Political activities like Dharanas, hunger strikes and other practices like satyagraha have no place in a constitutional democracy, much less in academic institutions. Anyone indulging in the said activities in an educational institution would make himself liable to be expelled and /or rusticated. Educational institutions are meant for imparting education and not politics.

The police should ensure that the orders of this court are not violated and the academic atmospheres in educational institutions are not disturbed. The educational institution cannot be hijacked and be permitted to turn into a political battle field.






