St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara Our Patron Saint & Inspiration

St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara was born on 10th February 1805 at Kainakary, Kerala. At the age of five he began his studies in a village school, known as 'Kalari'. When he was 13, he joined the seminary at Pallipuram for his priestly training. While he was in the seminary, his parents and his eldest brother died in a epidemic. On 29th November 1829, he was ordained a priest,

St. Chavara was instrumental in founding two Catholic Religion Congreg ations one for men, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), and the other for women, Congregation of Mother of Carmel (CMC), for the spiritual renewal and all round development of the society.

Establishing seven ashrams and a convent in different parts of Kerala, Chavara initiated a spiritual movement among the people of Kerala. He established the first Catholic Sanskrit School, a major seminary and a printing and publishing house at Mannanam. He directed that every church should start a school attached to it and encouraged children from

even poor families to attend the schools by supplying midday meals and clothes to wear. He founded a 'Home of Charity' to take care of destitute, the beggars, the uncared sick and the old. He also organized the first voluntary charitable association in Kerala for self-help among the needy.

Even in the midst of such manifold activities, he found times to write several literary and spiritual book in prose as well as verse. Among them, 'Anastasyayude Rakthasakshyam' is the first narrative poem and 'Nalagamangal' the first chronicle of history in Malayalam. He knew seven languages - Malayalam, Tamil, Sanskrit, Syriac, Latin, Italian and Portuguese.

Essentially, however, St. Chavara was a man of piety and great charity. He lived for 65 years and died on 3rd January 1986. His sanctity was officially recognized by the church, when Pope John Paul II declared him 'Blessed' on 8th February 1986. Blessed Chavara 'Deo Volente' was canonized in 23rd November 2014 by Pope Francis.

St. Chavara is the heavenly patron of all CMI and CMC institutions. Let us pray to him to intercede before God for all our needs, especially for success in our academic endeavours. The celestial symphony of the sound and spirit of our founder, St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara is the inspiration that ever accelerated the onward march of the KE College that remain a flagship service in the academic perfection for the modern youth today. KE College symbolizes its Master's voice. "I am the truth, the way and the life".

We aspire towards creating a just humane society where dignity of the human person is respected, where unjust social structures are challenged, where our cultural heritage of Ahimsa, Religious Harmony and National unity are upheld, and where the poor and the marginalised are specially taken care of.

FACETS OF HISTORY

Kuriakose Elias College was established and is administered by St. Joseph's Monastery, Mannanam, the Mother House of the CMI Congregation. The College is built on the same beautiful hill where in 1846, Saint Kuriakose Elias took the first step towards secular education by starting the "Sanskrit School". It was here in Mannanam that the first press of the Catholic Church in India (third in the state of Kerala) came up. This was also the place which saw the publication of the first Malayalam daily (Nazrani Deepika) in 1887. The first English medium school of the Catholics in Kerala was started here in 1881. St. Ephrem's High School, one of the first high schools in Kerala came up here in Mannanam, in 1885. Mannanam thus has made solid contributions to the cultural, educational and spiritual spheres right from the inception of the CMI congregation in 1831.

K.E. College was established as a Junior College in 1964 to give the catholic youth, the benefits of higher education through a congenial catholic environment. The college fulfills this aim, working hand in hand with the Government and University and giving due respect to the rights of the minorities guaranteed by the Constitution of India. Rev. Fr. Fabian CMI, the Prior of St. Joseph's Monastery was the Founder Manager and inspirational force behind the construction of the college building. Rev. Fr. Papias CMI was the first Principal of the college. The college was affiliated to the Kerala University and upgraded as a Degree college in 1967. Since 1983, the college has been under the jurisdiction of the Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam. In the short span of fifty eight years, the college has become a great centre of learning and a source of inspiration to the people of Kerala.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The Congregation of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate undertakes educational apostolate, based on the love of God and service to mankind as modelled in Jesus Christ, against the background of Indian heritage so as to produce intellectually competent, morally upright, socially committed and spiritually inspired men and women of India. In pursuance of the above general objective of education, the college has been redefining its objectives from time to time. Today the college stands for the following objectives:

For the accomplishment of the above goals, the College is putting in special efforts to enable the students to strive for excellence in every field, to seek and apply knowledge to find solutions to various social problems, to value and use their freedom with responsibility, to be clear and firm on principles and values and to be selfless in rendering services, through a team of teachers who are active, dedicated, competent and humane in dealings.

MANAGEMENT

The College is managed by the Kuriakose Elias Educational and Charitable Trust, Mannanam. The Prior of St. Joseph's Monastery is the Chairman of the Trust and the manager of the College. The general management of the college is vested in the Governing Body whose chairman is the Manager and Principal is the Secretary. Other members are appointed as per the provisions of the Mahatma Gandhi University statutes.

COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS



DISCIPLINE

- i. Every student of the college is bound to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/herself with decency and decorum for a peaceful atmosphere conducive to study and maintain discipline on the campus. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including suspension or dismissal.
- ii. Class hours are from 09.40 am to 03.40 pm. Be in time for the classes.
- iii. Students should come to come to attention when the prayer song begins and keep standing till it ends, wherever in the campus, whether in the class or outside.
- iv. Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the members of the staff or students on the college campus or to attend college functions without the permission of the Principal. Only parents/guardians are permitted. Strict action will be taken against those who bring outsiders to the campus.
- v. Students should not bring any press reporters and media persons to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the Principal.
- vi. When the students meet a teacher within the campus or outside, greet him/her as a mark of respect.
- vii. Seek permission of the teacher before entering and leaving a class in session.
- viii. Students are not allowed to use the mobile phones on the college campus as per the Government order (GO. No. RT/No.346/5 Higher Edn. dated 01-03-2005). Those who are found to be in violation of this rule will have to face the consequences and their mobile phones will be confiscated and fines levied.
- ix. Campus politics, political activism, strikes, slogan shouting, processions, crowding on the campus, display of political banners and flags, and sticking notices on the wall are banned on the campus
- x. All types of ragging and eve-teasing are strictly prohibited.
- xi. Smoking, consumption of alcoholic beverages and use of narcotic drugs are strictly prohibited. Criminal proceedings will be taken against those found under the influence of alcohol or narcotic drugs within the campus.



- xii. Any meeting of the faculty, staff or students on the college campus shall be arranged only with the permission of the college authorities.
- xiii. Students should not wander in the campus or engage in group activities while standing on the verandas.
- xiv. During free hours the students are expected to make use of the library or engage in meaningful co-curricular activities.
- xv. All the celebrations of the college should be modest.
- xvi. Cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted on the campus.
- xvii. Students are strictly forbidden from entering classrooms other than theirs.
- xviii. Any student under suspension is forbidden from entering the college campus.
- xix. The properties of the college must be handled with utmost care by the students. Do not disfigure the college furniture, walls, doors or windows with drawings, engravings or posters. Do not tamper with electrical installations. Any impairment cost to any of the furniture and other items will be dealt with by the imposition of fines and penal actions.
- xx. Students are expected to contact their respective departments and check the tabulation of attendance regularly and rectify the mistakes, if any.
- xxi. Malpractices in examinations will lead to necessary disciplinary action as per the regulations
- xxii. All catholic students are to attend the Holy Mass in the College Chapel on the first Friday of every month.
- xxiii. Students should not throw litter in the campus.
- xxiv. The vehicles of the students must only be parked in areas designated to them.
- xxv. Students should leave the campus before 5 pm.
- xxvi. Character and conduct has to be earned by a student's good conduct and behaviour. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the Principal is entitled to refuse admission to an applicant, to suspend, dismiss or take any other punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct. Misconduct shall include:



- a. Staying away from classes without sufficient reason.
- b. Disrespectful behaviour towards the members of the staff.
- c. Provoking students to strike and participate in strike, dharna etc. in the college.
- d. Disorderly behaviour in the class.
- e. Organising tours without the permission of the Principal.
- f. Loitering in and around the main gate, porch, stairs and the verandas during free hours and creating disturbance to the classes in progress.
- g. Distributing leaflets, hand-bills or other materials and displaying banners and posters inside the campus.
- h. Scribbling offensive, abusive or obscene words or drawing figures on black boards or any kind of writings on the walls or other places in the college or on the campus.
- i. Exerting undue influence on fellow students.

Dress Code

There is a prescribed uniform for the first year students. All the first year students are expected to wear uniforms on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. The College expects all the other students to keep in mind the basic norms of modesty and decency with regard to dress. Students should restrain from wearing casual dress, low waist pants/jeans, torn jeans coloured dhothis, collarless T- shirts, T-shirts with writings/pictures and short skirts/short tops. Do not tuck up your dhothis when you are in the campus.

Identity Card

The students are expected to wear the college identity card visible and should be shown to the authorities and to the security guard when demanded. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc. and entry into college premises including Principal's room, staff rooms, class rooms, examination halls, library, auditorium, laboratories, open air auditorium will be made only on production of the Identity Card. For availing of any service from the college, identity cards is mandatory. If a student loses her/his identity card, a duplicate can be obtained immediatly on payment of ₹200/. The Identity Card shall be surrendered to the office at the time



of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/ Qualifying Certificates, whichever is earlier.

RAGGING: A SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENCE

Ragging is a punishable offence. All type of ragging and eve-teasing are strictly prohibited on the campus as per the Govt. Notification No 16992/Leg. Bl/98/Law dated. 24-06-1998 and those who indulge in it or encourage it, will be handed over to the law as per UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009 and as per the provisions of the Ragging Prohibition Act, 1998.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING RAGGING

As per the UGC regulations 2009. Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- (a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- (b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- (c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect or causing in generating a sense of shame, or torment or embracement so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student,
- (d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student including a fresher.
- (e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or group of students.
- (f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- (g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forced obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- (h) Any act or abuse by spoken words which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively



participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

(i) Any act that affect he mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

PUNISHMENTS

The UGC regulations stipulate that students can be expelled from an institute and debarred from taking admission to any other institute for a specified period after being found guilty of the offence.

As per the regulations any students can be fined up to Rs. 2.5 Lakhs if found guilty of ragging. The UGC regulations provide for justification of a student, a period from one to four semesters.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence ss established by the Anti- Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- (a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- (b) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- (c) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- (d) Withholding results.
- (e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- (f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- (g) Cancellation of admission
- (h) Rustication from the institution for periods ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- (i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
- (j) Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000/- and Rupees 2.5 lakh
- (k) Collective punishment: When the persons who committed or abetted the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.



GUIDELINES TO PREVENT SEXUAL HARASSMENT AGAINST WOMEN IN THE COLLEGE-POLICY AND PROCEDURE

- i. The girl students enjoy equal rights and status with boys in the college.
- ii. To protect the necessary privacy of girl students, a separate waiting room cum lunch hall with sufficient toilet facility is provided in the college. A quadrangle specifically for girls is provided in the campus and a separate room is provided for girls in the college canteen.
- iii. Male students are not permitted to the areas specified exclusively for girls.
- iv. Sexual harassment of any sort shall not be tolerated. The sexual harassment is defined as the request for sexual favours and other verbal (including written and electronic communications) or physical contact of a sexual nature.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

The institution has constituted Internal Complaints Committee in accordance with UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Workers and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015 consisting of senior women faculty members to move proactively to curb sexual harassment, humiliation and exploitation of employees and students on the campus and to deal with the issue of gender based violence. Where sexual harassment occurs, the ICC shall take all steps necessary and reasonable to assist the affected person in terms of support and preventive action. The ICC shall comply with the procedure prescribed in the aforementioned UGC Regulations 2015 for inquiring into the complaint in a time bound manner. The ICC will also inform employees and students of the recourse available to them if they are victims of sexual harassment. It will treat sexual harassment as a misconduct under service rules and initiate action for misconduct if the perpetrator is an employee; and as a violation of the disciplinary rules (leading up to rustication and expulsion) if the perpetrator is a student.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- i. The college follows day order system and the time table is followed accordingly.
- ii. A working day is divided into two sessions: the forenoon session (FN) of 3



- periods and the afternoon session (AN) of 2 periods on I, II & V days and 3 periods on III & IV days.
- iii. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period by the member of the teaching staff in charge of the class.
- iv. Students shall occupy their respective seats before attendance is taken. Latecomers should not enter the class room, nor should any student leave the class room, without the permission of the member of the teaching staff in charge of the class.
- v. Latecomers may be refused attendance for the period or marked late at the discretion of the teaching staff concerned.
- vi. Those students going for sports, games, competitions or official purposes of the union activities etc. should apply for prior permission from the Principal on the prescribed form, countersigned by the Head of the Department or teacher concerned in order to be eligible for leave. Non-compliance will be considered absence from class.
- vii. The Semester-wise certificate of attendance and progress required by the University for promotion or for admission to the University Examination will, in no case be granted unless (i) a student has attended not less than three fourths of the number of working days for his/her course during the academic year, and (ii) the Principal is satisfied that the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
- viii. No student shall absent himself / herself from class without leave. Application for leave of absence should be made to the Head of the Department, through the class teacher, in the prescribed form not later than the first date of return to the college after the absence. A student who is present can't leave without permission.
- ix. Every application for leave shall be countersigned by the Parent or Guardian as the case may be. Incomplete applications will be rejected.
- x. When leave is required in case of illness, for more than three consecutive working days, application for the same must be supported by a Medical Certificate.
- xi. If absent without leave for one period, a student will lose attendance for the whole session. When the total days of absence in a Semester exceed five, the parent / guardian of the student shall meet the HoD and give



- satisfactory explanation. This has to be followed for every five days of absence.
- xii. A student absenting himself/herself without leave for more than ten consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the roll, and he/she may be readmitted only on payment of the admission fee and the College fee dues, if any.
- xiii. Absence without leave from any terminal or class examination or from practical work will be taken seriously.

CONDONATION OF SHORTAGE OF ATTENDENCE

Students should get 75% of attendance for all the courses in a semester and the deficiency will be condoned only when the University Syndicate is satisfied that the absence was for reasons beyond the control of the student. Deficiency beyond 10 days (UG) and 15 days (PG) will, on no account, be condoned and exemption will not be granted for more than two semesters in any course of study.

Benefit of attendance may be granted to students attending University / College Union/ Co-curricular activities by treating them as present for the days of absence. This is applicable on production of participation / attendance certificates, within one week, from competent authorities and endorsed by the Head of the Institution. This benefit is limited to a maximum of 10 days per semester and shall be considered for internal assesment also.

Those students who are not eligible even with condonation of shortage of attendance shall repeat the semester along with the next batch after obtaining readmission.

PAYMENT OF FEES

- i. Fees are to be paid in three equal instalments (or in one lot for the full year). Special fees will be collected along with the first instalment.
- ii. If a student fails to pay the fee on the due date, he/she shall pay a fine of 5/- along with the fee on or before the 10th day after the due date; if the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be considered as the 10th day.
- iii. If the fees and fines are not paid before the last opportunity given for payment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with



effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be readmitted, he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also remit all arrears of fees with fine. No readmission fee will be realised in such cases of readmission. The readmitted student will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of readmission.

- iv. If the fee payment date happens to be a holiday, the fee should be remitted on the next working day.
- v. If a student studying in an Arts or Science College leaves with a T.C. and is admitted to another similar college, he/she shall pay the fees for the term only in one college. He/she should produce the receipts and certificate of remittance obtained from the college which he/she has left, at the college where he/she is admitted. However, special fees and caution deposit will have to be paid again at the new college. The above mentioned provisions are applicable in the case of this college, with regard to inter college transfer.
- vi. Absence with or without leave from the College shall not be an excuse for non-payment of fees at the proper date.
- vii. No part payment will be accepted. Remember, the fees are to be remitted to the Government Treasury on the prescribed date.
- viii. Students who are admitted for a term for making up shortage of attendance for the course which the student was undergoing, should pay one third of the tuition fees for the year together with full fees and caution deposit at the time of admission. Only the former students of this college will be admitted as term students.
- ix. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are bonafide subjects of Kerala State are eligible for full fee concession and stipend. They will have to produce a certificate of nativity and community from a Revenue Officer not below the rank of a Thahsildar.
- x. On the days fixed for the payment of fees for a particular class, fees from other classes will not be accepted.
- xi. All cash transactions will be closed at 2 pm.
- xii. Filing of application for the End-Semester Examination by the students is

allowed only after the settlement of all the outstanding dues to the college.

A. Caution Deposit

- Caution Deposit after deduction of dues, if any, will be refunded on the completion of the course of study or when the student leaves the college with a Transfer Certificate.
- ii. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of his/her caution deposit in time.
- iii. Claim for refund of caution deposit should be made before the opening of the college after the completion of the course. Amounts that remain unclaimed after two months from the date of the course completion will be forfeited.
- iv. The students should keep in safe custody the receipts issued for remittance of the caution deposit and it should be produced along with the application for refund of the caution deposit. Failure to produce the original receipt is forfeiture of the claim for the refund.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

- i. A student who has paid all dues to the College is entitled to a Transfer Certificate (T.C.) at the end of an academic year or when he/she leaves the college for better courses of study, and if the progress and conduct are good or satisfactory, as stipulated by University regulations.
- ii. A student past or present, desiring to obtain a certificate (Transfer, Course & Conduct, Age, Marks, and Identification etc.) shall apply to the Principal in writing stating the year of study and the class number.
- iii. In case a student is expelled from the college for serious misconduct or repeated misbehaviour, his/her T.C. will be sent to the Registrar of the University and the matter will be reported to his/her parent or guardian.
- iv. Every student should collect his/her T.C. at the end of his/her course and produce it when admitted to the next course. T. C. will be issued only



- against the surrender of the identity card.
- v. Conduct Certificate is a document which a student has to earn. It is not issued as a matter of right. Conduct Certificate is issued on the basis of an overall evaluation by the teachers concerned.

INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS

- i. There will be internal examinations in each semester.
- ii. 20% of the grade/mark will be awarded by the respective department, regarding a student's academic progress and this will be incorporated in the final mark/grade sheet issued by the University.
- iii. After each examination, parents will be asked to come to the department concerned, when informed and enquire of their ward's progress.
- iv. Students are not allowed to absent themselves from exams, test papers, seminars and internal assignments.
- v. The internal assessment marks are determined on the basis of the class attendance as well.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM

A Grievances Redressal cell functions in the college, in order to settle the grievances of students. It is a three tier system which functions in the following way.

- Tier 1 Class Teacher
- Tier 2 Head of the Department
- Tier 3 Principal / Principal in consultation with College Council

Any matter of complaint/act of indiscipline of a student, shall be first brought to the notice of the class teacher concerned and if the student/complainant is denied justice, he/she shall approach the HoD. If justice is denied there also, the matter shall be brought to the notice of the Principal and settled by him.

EXCURSION AND STUDY TOURS

Excursion and study tours by students are permitted as part of the curricular and co-curricular programme, under the following stipulations.

i. Only final year students are allowed to organise study tour/excursions.



- ii. This should be done only with the prior permission of the class teacher, Head of the Dept. concerned and the Principal. Students are to obtain letters of consent from their parent/s
- iii. Booking of vehicles and arrangements for stay while on tour should be made only after consultation with the concerned authorities.
- iv. Class Teacher(s) or other teachers deputed by the respective Head of the Dept. should accompany the students.
- v. The maximum number of days for a tour shall be three. However, for Zoology, Botany and Chemistry students, the number of days shall be fixed by the respective departments.
- vi. Any act of indiscipline while on tour shall be considered an act of indiscipline committed on the campus and will attract punitive action.
- vii. As far as possible, study tours shall be conducted during November/ December soon after the semester examinations.
- viii. Each member of the touring party should see that his / her conduct enhances the prestige and reputation of the institution.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

- i. Only students, researchers, faculty members and staff as registered members are allowwed to use the college library.
- Members are allowed to enter the library only on production of their authorised/valid identity cards. Without Identity Cards library service will be refused to them.
- iii. Users mays swipe their identity card at the gate entry monitoring system.
- iv. Students are allowed to take only one note book into the library.
- Other text books, printed materials, issued books, umbrellas and other personal belongings should be kept in the shelves for personal effects at the entrance.
- vi. Silence must be strictly observed in the library.
- vii. Students shall not exchange books borrowed from the library.
- viii. Students may freely select books from the shelves. But they should be careful in replacing the books so that the books are not misplaced.
- ix. Students will be permitted to take two books on loan at a time. Books in



the Reference Section will not be lent out.

- x. The librarian may recall any book at any time even before the due date.
- xi. Students will be responsible for any damage caused to books. Pencil marks, ink-stain etc. made in a book will be treated as damage. When a book is issued to a student, he/she may point out to the librarian or his assistants any damage/defect noted concerning a book; otherwise it will be presumed that the book was intact when it was issued.
- xii. If a book is damaged or lost by a student he/she will have to replace it or pay three times of the cost of the book.
- xiii. The period of loan is 14 days. Books may be re-issued for a further period of 14 days if there is no other demand for them. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for delay in the return of books.
- xiv. Failure to return book on the due date entails a student to pay a fine of ₹ 1.00 per day of delay except for intervening Sundays and public holidays.
- xv. Each student will be issued two Reader's Tickets. Books can be borrowed against them. Students must ensure that they get back their reader's tickets when they return the books. A sum of ₹ 25.00 will be charged for the loss of each Reader's Ticket. This does not, however, absolve the holder from the responsibility for books borrowed against tickets lost. Duplicates may be issued 15 days after the report of the loss.
- xvi. Students are required to return all library books before 31st March every year. Final year students shall return their tickets also by that date. Defaulters will be charged the cost of books and a fine of ₹ 1.00 per day per item for the entire period of delay.

CBCS REGULATIONS FOR UG

(Extract of rules and regulations - 2017 Admission onwards)

The duration of U.G. programmes shall be 6 semesters. There shall be two Semesters in an academic year, the "ODD" semester commences in June and on completion, the "EVEN" Semester commences. There shall be two months vacation during April/May.

SCHEME AND SYLLABUS

The U.G. programmes shall include (a) Common Courses I and II, (b) Core Course(s), (c) Complementary/Vocational Courses, and (d) Open Course. There shall be one Choice Based course (Elective Course) in the sixth semester. In the case of B.Com Programme there shall be an elective stream from third semester onwards. A separate minimum of 30% marks each for internal and external (for both theory and practical) and aggregate minimum of 35% are required for a pass for a course. For a pass in a programme, a separate minimum of Grade D is required for all the individual courses. The practical examinations (external/internal) will be conducted only at the end of even semesters for all programmes.

EXAMINATIONS

The evaluation of each paper shall contain two parts:

- (i) Internal or In-Semester Assessment (ISA)
- (ii) External or End-Semester Assessment (ESA)

The internal to external assessment ratio shall be 1:4.

Both internal and external marks are to be rounded to the next integer.

For all papers (theory & practical), grades are given on a 7-point scale based on the total percentage of marks, (ISA+ESA) as given below:

ASSIGNMENTS

Assignments are to be done from 1st to 4th Semesters. At least one assignment should be done in each semester for all courses.

SEMINAR/VIVA

A student shall present a seminar in the 5th semester for each paper and appear for Viva-voce in the 6th semester for each course.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT TEST PAPERS

Two test papers are to be conducted in each semester for each course. The evaluations of all components are to be published and are to be acknowledged by the candidates. All documents of internal assessments are to be kept in the college for one year and shall be made available for verification by the University. The responsibility of evaluating the internal assessment is vested on the teacher(s), who teach the course.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The external theory examination of all semesters shall be conducted by the University at the end of each semester. Students having a minimum of 75% average attendance for all the courses only can register for the examination. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of 2 times during the whole period of the programme may be granted by the University on valid grounds. This condonation shall not be counted for internal assessment. Benefit of attendance may be granted to students attending University/College union/Co-curricular activities by treating them as present for the days of absence, on production of participation/attendance certificates, within one week, from competent authorities and endorsed by the Head of the institution. This is limited to a maximum of 10



days per semester and this benefit shall be considered for internal assessment also. Those students who are not eligible even with condonation of shortage of attendance shall repeat the semester along with the next batch after obtaining readmission.

CREDIT AND SEMESTER SYSTEM FOR PG PROGRAMMES

(Extract of rules and regulations)

These Regulations shall be called Mahatma Gandhi University Regulations (2019) governing postgraduate programmes under the Credit Semester System (MGU-CSS- PG). These regulations shall come into force from the academic year 2019-2020.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Students shall be admitted into postgraduate programme under the faculties. The programme shall include two types of courses, Program Core (PC) courses and Program Elective (PE) Courses. There shall be a Program Project (PP) with dissertation to be undertaken by all students. The programme will also include assignments, seminars / practical viva etc., if they are specified in the curriculum. There shall be various groups of Programme Elective courses for a programme such an Group A, Group B etc. for the choice of students



subject to the availability of faculty and infrastructure in the institution and the selected group shall be the subject of specialization of the programme.

PROJECT WORK

Project work shall be completed by working outside the regular teaching hours and carried out under the supervision of a teacher in the department concerned. There should be an internal assessment and external assessment for the project work. The external evaluation of the project work is followed by presentation of work including dissertation and viva-voce.

ASSIGNMENTS

Every student shall submit one assignment as an internal component for every course with weightage one.

SEMINAR LECTURES

Every PG student shall deliver one seminar lecture as an internal component for every course with weightage two. The seminar lecture is expected to train the student in self-study, collection of relevant matter from books and Internet resources, editing, document writing, typing and presentation.

CLASS TESTS

Every student shall undergo at least two class tests as an internal component for every course with weightage one each. The best of two shall we taken for awarding the grade for class tests.

ATTENDANCE

- i. The minimum requirement of aggregate attendance during a semester for appearing the end semester examination shall be 75%. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 15 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of postgraduate programme may be granted by the university.
- ii. If a student represents his/her institution, university, state or nation in sports, NCC, NSS or cultural or any other officially sponsored activities such as college union / university union activities, he/she shall be eligible to claim attendance for the actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 15 days in a semester based on the specific recommendations of the Head of the Department and Principal of the College concerned.
- iii. A student who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance shall not be permitted to take the end semester examinations.



EXAMINATIONS

- i. There shall be university examination at the end of each semester.
- Practical examinations shall be conducted by the university at the end of each semester.
- iii. Project evaluation and viva -voce shall be conducted at the end of the programme only. Practical examination, project evaluation and viva-voce shall be conducted by two external examiners and one internal examiner.
- iv. End-Semester Examinations: The examinations shall normally be at the end of each semester.
- v. There shall be one end-semester examination of 3 hours duration in each lecture- based course and practical course.
- vi. A question paper may contain short answer type/annotation, short essay type questions/problems and long essay type questions. Different types of questions shall have different weightage to quantify their range. Weightage can vary from course to course depending on their comparative importance, but a general pattern may be followed by the Board of Studies.

EVALUATION AND GRADING

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts; (a) internal evaluation and (b) external evaluation. 25% weightage shall be given to internal evaluation and the remaining 75% to external evaluation and the ratio and weightage between internal and external is 1:3. Both internal and external evaluations shall be carried out using direct grading system.

INTERNAL EVALUATION

The internal evaluation shall be based on predetermined transparent system involving periodic written tests, assignments, seminars and attendance in respect of theory courses and based on written tests, lab skill/records/viva and attendance in respect of practical courses.

DIRECT GRADING SYSTEM

Direct Grading System based on a 7-point scale is used to evaluate the performance (External and Internal Examination of students).

Honorable High Court judgement in case No. 1806 of 2017 dtd 19-10-2017 filed by Kuriakose Elias College, Mannanam

Educational Institutions cannot be turned into a political battle ground. In an educational institution, there cannot be politics. Any individual student interested in politics is free to indulge in his interest, but outside the educational institution. These institutions are teaching and learning institutions. The police would be duty bound to give all assistance in the matter so that upon timely interventions, the Dharanas and vandalism is put under control.

Political activities like Dharanas, hunger strikes and other practices like satyagraha have no place in a constitutional democracy, much less in academic institutions. Anyone indulging in the said activities in an educational institution would make himself liable to be expelled and /or rusticated. Educational institutions are meant for imparting education and not politics.

The police should ensure that the orders of this court are not violated and the academic atmospheres in educational institutions are not disturbed. The educational institution cannot be hijacked and be permitted to turn into a political battle field.
