## 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

A slew of measures adopted by the various departments of our college have been proven to be effective. Here, we would like to give a brief description of our initiatives/activities. We believe that pedagogy is equally crucial in spite of a well framed syllabus. Holistic development of our students is our priority.

Formal class room teaching (lecture method) is the one used in our institution. In addition to formal class room instruction, teachers guide their students with study materials and demonstration to impart learning; both theory and practical of subjects taught in class. Every batch of students is allotted a specific class teacher so that individual care can be given to all the students. Seminars, assignments, weekly test papers etc are done systematically. OHP, LCD projectors, models etc are used by the teachers as aids of teaching. Classes are taken by the help of power point slides using LCD projector for better assimilation of complex ideas. We provide UGC-CSIR NET and SET coaching for our students along with remedial classes. The brighter students of various batches aid their teachers in providing remedial classes to weaker students from the school of sciences.

We have adopted ICT based Teaching and Learning design in our departments. We have computer labs for various departments. High speed Internet connection is also made available for the students. The Degree and Post graduate students of the department of chemistry are provided free access to a plethora of software such as ChemsSketch, Chem Draw, GAMESS, etc. The department of Botany conducts a common entrance test to determine the potential of students coming from different backgrounds. Assignments are given once a week and the students are encouraged to send the same to their departmental portal. Students who perform well in their tests are inducted to the A stream, where they are given additional training for imparting their knowledge to weaker students.

The department of Economics employs various teaching- learning strategies such as interactive methods, group discussions, assignments, seminars and projects. I.C.T teaching and learning facility is provided to our students. Seminars and lectures by eminent personas of the profession are organized by the department every year to enlighten the students on various issues. Remedial coaching is given to the less performing students of the various departments.

The Department of English takes particular care in enhancing the learning process by employing innovative teaching strategies. The learning experience is given a first-hand experience by enacting many of the stories by the students such as in the course of Reading Drama. The visual effects for the literary pieces are also taken care of by comparing the written script with audio-visual aids such as CDs and cassettes. ICT is also made use of in Language classes, which lays emphasis on phonetics and grammar, for students coming from various departments. Literary fests are conducted every year to encourage the active

participation of students in pruning their own writing skills. Prizes are distributed to the winners at the end of the academic year.

The department of history conducts a visit every year to reputed organizations and holds an annual meeting which takes into consideration the immediate concerns of the students. The Math's department hosts a series of competitions from Quizzing to debates, an initiative meant for the overall development of the students.

The department of Psychology conducts class tests every month and a continuous assessment of each student is kept in the archives of the department. Besides these, Quiz competitions, Jigsaw contests etc are also held every year along with seminars, conferences etc. Workshops on latest statistical packages such as SPSSR are conducted by the department of Statistics every year. Classes are made more interactive with the aid of multimedia for PG students.

The department of Zoology has always been keen on imparting proper learning experience to the students. In addition to use of usual teaching aids such as charts, specimens, models etc. Classroom learning is made interesting using PowerPoint presentations. This helps the students to acquire knowledge beyond textbooks and enrich them with the latest available information on the topics. Practical classes are also conducted in this manner to minimise the use of lab animals. Hands-on experience is provided to the students in various aspects like sampling techniques, insect collection and preservation, vermin composting etc. Field visit to wildlife sanctuaries and different types of habitats are conducted to enhance the learning experience of the students. Apart from this, group learning is promoted where the weak students are helped by their peers who excel in studies. The students' notice board of the Department also helps them to share the latest developments in the field of science. Question banks are prepared for each subject and discussed in classrooms as and when required. Continuous evaluation and assessment is done and the feedback is taken for improvement of teaching. The department has also adopted peer evaluation to help the students in improving their responses.

The teaching- learning process in the department of Commerce is based on ICT. The department makes effective use of advanced technologies like ICT in teaching in addition to the traditional pedagogy at both UG and PG levels. The class-rooms have upgraded projectors. The students can make use of the Departmental library, well stocked with more than 500 books. Internet facilities are also provided for their convenience. The teaching is imparted through ICT enabled techniques for knowledge dissemination and knowledge generation. Department conducts group discussions, seminars, industrial visits, remedial coaching, etc. for the students

2.8 Examination/ Evaluation Reforms initiated by the Institution (for example: Open Book Examination, Bar Coding, Double Valuation, Photocopy, Online Multiple Choice Questions)

**Performances are assessed by Continuous Evaluation Process as per curriculum guidelines. Progress of the students is evaluated on a continuous basis. Unit tests are conducted on completion of every module of syllabus. At the end of every semester, two internal examinations are conducted. The students are required to take seminars related to their subject area. The weaker ones are given extra attention and their performance is discussed with the parents individually through open evaluation system. PTA meetings of each class were organized by class teachers once in an academic year.**

**Examination/evaluation process by some of the departments is mentioned below.**

**In the Department of Economics the internal examinations are conducted in the department to continuously assess the performance of the students and the results are communicated in time to the students. An open house programme is conducted every semester to discuss the performance of the students. Remedial coaching is given to the weak students of the department.**

**In the English department, internal exams as well as class tests are conducted by teachers, with every module covered allowing for a fast intake of syllabi by the students. Certain courses allow for Open Book Examination, testing the leaning capability of all pupils. Multiple choice questions are employed for one set of internal exams for the general classes in English.**

**In History department weekly examinations and evaluations are made possible. Make good rapport with parents. They conduct PTA meeting for each class separately.**

**In Maths department, weekly test papers were conducted for final year B.Sc. students and P.G. students. After each terminal examination the progress of each student was evaluated in the presence of their parents (open house evaluation). A lot of effort was taken by the teachers for conducting regular internal assignments and monitoring their progress. The class teachers identify the slow-learners of each class and remedial coaching was arranged for them with special focus on SC/ST.**

**The teaching learning process is constantly monitored by IQAC. The learning process is periodically checked by the internal exams and assignments given by the students. Seminars and Viva –voce are also resorted to, to test the skill and aptitude of the students.**

**Regular feedbacks from the students help monitor the quality of teaching of the faculty as well as the relevance of the curriculum. The class teacher acting as a mentor to the students forming a tutorial system is also supervised by the IQAC. Weak students are provided with remedial coaching and Bridge classes by the voluntary service of teachers in various departments.**

**The IQAC also promotes quality teaching by ensuring the availability of ICT in teaching, access to INFLIBNET, Open Access Journal, e-books etc. Various Add-on courses and certificate courses are offered by departments as encouraged by the IQAC of the college**

### 3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

#### 3.1 Initiatives of the IQAC in Sensitizing/Promoting Research Climate in the institution

The objective of the College is to become a centre of excellence in the field of higher education. This cannot be accomplished without promoting research to the maximum extent in various disciplines. At present three of our departments (Physics, Chemistry & Economics) are recognized as research centres by the MG University. Sixty percentage of the teaching faculty possesses research degrees. Also more than ten of them are approved research guides. Total number of ongoing projects in the college is four major projects and more than 15 minor projects. We are conducting seminars, workshops, Symposia etc. on a regular basis which give our student community an opportunity to meet researchers, academicians and other stake holders exchanging their ideas and information.

Both faculty and students of physics department are actively involved in research activities. At present the department is undertaking one major research project (KSCSTE - Dr Jini Thomas) and one minor research project (UGC – Dr. Feby Jose). Majority of the faculty members have applied for major/minor research projects to various agencies

Dr. Jaiby Joseph has research collaboration with Indian Neutrino Observatory (INO) which will lead to major research opportunities both for faculty as well as students. Research oriented projects are given to PG students to introduce them into the field of active research.

Dr. Jollyamma Mathew, and Dr. Jesty Thomas, of Chemistry department are working as research guides, from the MG University. Currently the department has three ongoing major projects (Dr. Jesty Thomas is the Principal Investigator of two projects and Dr. Giable George is the Principal Investigator of one project). The Department has four ongoing minor projects funded by UGC, DST and KSCSTE. Three research fellows are working in three different major projects; among them two have applied for Ph.D registration.

The faculty members of chemistry have presented several research papers in various international and national conferences and they have published research papers in both international and national Journals. The Department of Science and Technology (DST), Govt. of Kerala has sanctioned a sum of Rs.77 lakhs under the FIST Programme to

strengthen teaching and research facilities in all the science departments of the college, after assessing the performance of the departments.

The Research and Post Graduate Department of Economics is one of the most prestigious academic centres of learning Economics in Kerala. The upgradation of the department as a research department in 2013 gave an impetus to the research activities of the department. Presently the department has 2 research guides (Dr. Cyriac Joseph & Dr. Jose. A) and 10 research scholars are actively pursuing research under them.

The department of Commerce is providing a conducive environment for the research activities. Both degree and P.G students are undertaking research projects as part of the curriculum. The teachers holding Ph.D guide the students which is an encouragement for the students to undertake research. The teachers are also encouraged to undertake minor and major research projects. The faculty members in the Department of Commerce are actively involved in publishing research articles in Books, International and National journals. Students are exposed to project work for hands on experience in research. It also arranges research discussion with research holders.

The Hindi department collected Research Articles from well-known writers and scholars and published a book. Dr. Babu Joseph of Hindi Department conducted training programmes for Official Language Hindi for Government employees. He has also published a Research article on ‘Samakaleen Hindi Kavitha Mein Nari Vimarsh’ in the UGC National Seminar Proceedings Published by the PG and Research Department of Hindi, Catholocate College, Pathanamthitta.

In Malayalam department all the teachers are actively involved in research activities. Dr. J. Mathew is a research guide.

In the English department, Dr. Sujarani Mathew has got recognition as research guide and guiding Ph.D scholars.

Dr. Sunny Joseph Kalayathankal of Mathematics Department is an approved Research Guide in Mahatma Gandhi University. He has already Guide ship in Karpagam University and Bharathiyar University of Tamil Nadu. He has 7 research scholars working under his guidance.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

The department of Botany, KE College initiated a taxonomic drive, Identifying and naming plants as a service to the neighbourhood people and institutions. Students in groups took initiative in generating awareness on the usage of common medicinal plants in the households of Mannanam and nearby localities. Hands-on training was given to open course students of the college and III Year students in Mushroom cultivation and different horticultural practices such as budding, grafting, layering etc. As an extension of Career Oriented (Add-on) Course,- 'Analytical Techniques in Water Analysis', steps have been taken by the Chemistry department for analyzing well water samples of nearby areas free of cost. A notice regarding this was circulated among the households of Aarpukara and Athirampuzha Panchayaths. People from this area are utilizing this facility now. From the results of the analysis, it was found that about 30% of the drinking water sources in Aarpukara Panchayathu, especially around Gandhinagar Medical college region, were contaminated and not fit for consumption. In such cases remedial measures were recommended. The Department has adopted right measures to give environmental awareness to our students. 'Environmental chemistry' was introduced as an Open course subject for students from other departments, to create awareness on the environmental hazards plaguing our society today.

Third year degree students of the department of Economics visited an orphanage 'Swathanam' situated near Medical College, Kottayam as part of social responsibility initiative on 21 Aug 2014. They spend a day with the inmates and distributed sweets and clothes.

The Department of English also conducted the extension activity of providing language skills to the school children of the neighbourhood. The language lab facility of the college is availed of to give maximum exposure to the students. Classes are taken by Third year students for the children of the Upper Primary School under the guidance of the teaching staff. The language lab imparts to the children, an immediate experience of listening and speaking skills. A Scholarship has been instituted to be given to the student who acquires highest marks in University examinations. The Department of Hindi conducts various competitions for students for promoting the National language. As per the request of the students, we invite well known writers from north India to inaugurate the Hindi Association every year. The department of History has been active in blood donation programmes for a long time. They have also been part of philanthropic activities, with a focus on the locales near our campus.

The department of Maths conducted tuition classes for the students of the St. Joseph U P School, Mannanam on all working days. The classes were handled by the 3rd D C and 2nd P G students under the supervision of faculty members of the Department. Students also visited the orphanage run by Navajeevan Trust at Kottayam under the joined initiative of the Department and the Vincent DePaul Society of the college. Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) was organized in Neendoor Panchayath and a detailed evaluation about that area was sent to the concerned authorities by the MSW department of our College.

The counselling centre in the psychology department gives Counselling service to the lay men and the needy. Educational counselling is given to the students. Final year degree students engaged in school counselling programme from September 2014 to February 2015. The department adopted St. Thomas School Neendoor for the programme. Various personality development programme organized by the students in different schools. Psychological classes and training were given by Dr. M.K. Mathew and Fr. Johnson Joseph to Police trainees at Kottayam Police training camp. Students along with the faculty members visited and conducted programme in Nava jeevan, Kottayam, Providence Home Gandhinagar and Cancer ward Kottayam Medical College. Technology assisted classes such as LCD and computer assisted group discussions and seminars are conducted regularly. Videos and demonstration of therapies- research on relevant issues- self assessment and teacher assessment etc are also provided by the department. Students are given training for soft skills development and personality development.

Dons N J, from the department of Zoology directed a short film titled 'Janithra' the central theme of which was 'responsible parenthood'. The film was screened in the film festival organised by the department. The film festival also screened a number of films which would help to inculcate love for nature and animals. The department also manages the vermicomposting pit of the college there by, helping in the efficient recycling of wastes. Also a majority of students actively participated in blood donation ventures.

The department of Commerce is providing Tax Consultancy service to the whole staff of the college free of cost. The teachers in the department help other staff to file income tax returns-submission etc. Tax consultancy services are also provided to plan the finances of an individual prudently so as to minimize the tax liability to people living in the nearby places.

The Grievance cell in the Departments will look into matters regarding internal evaluation marks. Students having any complaint against internal evaluation marks may appeal to this cell. If the mark given is not acceptable to the student, redressal of the grievance appealed for may be referred to the Principal. The department also has a computer lab fully equipped, providing services to the students in various practical aspects such as computerized accounting, IT for business etc.

#### 5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)

The Career Cell was very active in the academic year 2014-15. Prof. Rony George conducted several sessions to impart Group Discussion Techniques and interview tips to final year degree students, in collaboration with the Placement Cell. The career Cell was very keen to clarify the career doubts of students, regarding the future career prospects and higher education opportunities. The Career Guidance cell is giving training to 23 students of the college under Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP), a joint initiative of General and Higher Education Department to impart adequate skills to students through various career oriented programmes to match with labour market trends.

Remedial classes used to be conducted in our college, to enable students belonging to ST/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Minority communities to pursue their higher studies effectively and also to reduce the failure rate. The coaching was co-ordinated by Dr. Sandhya C, Assistant Professor, Department of Biochemistry. The grant was effectively utilized for providing academic facilities for the students. The faculty members of each department effectively conducted remedial classes outside the regular time table. Among the 142 students benefited from attending the classes, 53 were SC students, 8 were ST students and 81 were OBC/Minority Students.

**The college has a well developed MIS supported by properly maintained database. The student details, including internal marks are available in the college office on the click of a mouse. Similarly, the library has full-fledged information system that provides the details of book issue and availability of books.**

## 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

**The various Departments of the college offers comprehensive, contemporary and multi-disciplinary curriculum structured to equip the students with the knowledge, skills and tools needed to make them competitive in a global economic environment. The departments follow an updated curriculum revised by the university. Inter-disciplinary programs such as open course make students aware of all related fields. Open course opted by the departments is relevant one intended to promote individual, community and national development. The Departments also organize invited lectures, subject based exhibitions, field trips etc. for curriculum enrichment.**

**The design and structure of UG and PG courses are decided by the Mahatma Gandhi University through the “Board of Studies” and “Academic Council”. Department meetings are conducted to discuss the curriculum provided by the University. Suggestions arising from the discussion are conveyed to board of studies.**

### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

**The teaching and learning aspect gets the utmost care and attention in our college. Different departments are keen to give the best opportunities to the students. Some of the good practices followed by the departments are highlighted.**

**Large number of students of the Botany department is first generation learners. Slow and advanced learners are identified and enrichment programs are organized for them. Lecture method is supplemented by various other interactive techniques including modern teaching aids**

**In the Chemistry department, in addition to the formal class room instructions, teacher guide the students with study materials and demonstrations to impart -learning both theory and practical of Chemistry. Every batch of students is allotted a specific class teacher so that individual care can be given to all the students. Seminars, assignments,**

weekly test papers etc. are done systematically. OHP, LCD projectors, models etc are used by the teachers as aids of teaching. Department promotes UGC-CSIR NET and SET Coaching, and Remedial coaching for our students. The brighter students of various batches are given remedial classes to weaker students for Mathematics and Physics.

ICT based Teaching and learning design is adopted in the department. The department is having a computer lab with internet connection .The Degree and Post graduate students make use of the computer lab for their assignments and dissertation works. Chemistry software such as Chems sketch, Chem Draw, GAMESS are made available and students are given instructions to familiarise these software.

The department of economics has been following modern teaching methods for providing conceptual clarity to students. The department employs various teaching-learning methods such as interactive method, group discussions, assignments, seminars and projects. I.C.T teaching and learning facility is provided. Seminars and lectures by eminent persons of the profession are organized by the department every year to enlighten the students on various issues. Students are encouraged to use computer systems and internet facilities available in the department for their academic as well as project related enquiries.

The Department of English takes particular care in enhancing the learning process by employing innovative teaching strategies. The learning experience is given a first-hand experience by enacting many of the stories by the students, such as in the course of Reading Drama. The visual effect for the literary pieces as also taken care of by comparing the written script with audio-visual aids such as CDs and cassettes. ICT is also made use of in Language classes

The History department is conducting remedial coaching to the weak students on every Thursday. Blue prints of syllabus can be arranged by faculty. Discussion on different topics and subjects are made by the faculty members. Clarifications of doubts, clearance of the theme of study etc. are taken into consideration by the joint sitting of the faculty members. To know more about the vocational subject Printing and Publishing industrial visits are conducted.

Teaching learning and evaluation is done through proper planning and through the dedicated efforts of each member for its proper implementation in the Mathematics department. The department is very particular in making the learning process more students-centric. Though lecture method is followed, it is supplemented by notes charts models etc. A lot of effort is taken by the teachers for conducting regular internal

assignments and monitoring their progress. The teachers are using projectors and slides to take classes in order to help the students understand topics easier. Some creative movies regarding the topics are also shown. Weak students are encouraged to associate with bright students to uplift them to the main stream. Bright students are encouraged to do seminars on topics beyond the scope of the syllabus. Evening classes and extra classes on holidays are arranged to get more time for the extensive discussion of each topic. Bridge courses are arranged by the department to fill the gap between the current knowledge level of the students and their prescribed syllabus.

The department of Mathematics has an effective class teacher system. Each teacher is entrusted with a batch of students. He/She collects the Bio-data and a photograph of each student and a diary is maintained. The class teachers identify the slow-learners of each class and remedial coaching is arranged for them with special focus on SC/ST.

The Department provides library facilities with 500 books and computer lab facilities for familiarising maths software like Math lab, Math Code, SPSS, Latex and PDF converter to help the students.

### **Physics**

In the Physics department, each batch of students is allotted a class teacher. Individual care is given to all students. Attendance of all students for each day is recorded and personally verified by their respective class teacher. Both weak and bright students are given special care. Remedial coaching is given to weak students. Bright students are encouraged to apply for various scholarships provided by various national and state level research organizations. Invited talks are conducted throughout the academic wherein students are able to interact with experts

In order to impart proper learning experience regular classroom learning is done with teaching aids such as charts, specimen etc, in the Zoology department. Teaching is aided by LCD projectors to provide the much needed visual experience to understand various biological resources, systems and processes. The practical classes are also conducted in this manner to minimise the use of lab animals.. Field trips are conducted to provide hands on experience and training to students. Peer group learning is promoted by dividing the students of each class into smaller groups of 8-10 and discussions and presentations are held. Students are encouraged to share their knowledge and recent developments in the subject on student notice board thereby contributing towards the learning process. Apart from the structured curriculum students are given assignments on special topics related to it and common seminars were conducted for all students of the

department. Students are encouraged to do Power point presentations on scientific topics. Department also arranged lectures of eminent resource persons for enriching the students.

In the EEM department, each batch of students under the department are allotted a class teacher. Individual care is given to all students. Attendance of all student for each day is recorded and personally verified by their respective class teacher. Both weak and bright students are given special care. Remedial coaching is given to weak students. Bright students are encouraged to apply for various scholarships provided by various national and state level research organizations. Invited talks are conducted throughout the academic wherein students are able to interact with experts

The Department of Commerce offers comprehensive, contemporary and multi-disciplinary curriculum structured to equip the students with the knowledge, skills and tools needed to make them competitive in a global economic environment. The department follows an updated Curriculum revised by the university. Inter-disciplinary programs such as open course make students aware of all fields. Add-on Course on computerized accounting package -Tally is provided to the students.

Teaching and learning is facilitated through:

1. Comprehensive, contemporary and multi-disciplinary curriculum structured to equip the students with the knowledge, skills and tools needed to make them competitive.
2. Commerce Lab built with the objective of providing practical exposure to the students in addition to focusing on theoretical aspects
3. ICT enabled classrooms

### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Performances of the students are assessed by Continuous Evaluation Process as per curriculum guidelines. Progress of the students is evaluated on a continuous basis. Unit tests are conducted on completion of every module of syllabus. At the end of every semester, two internal examinations are conducted. The students are required to take seminars related to their subject area. The weaker ones are given extra attention and their

performance is discussed with the parents individually through open evaluation system. PTA meetings of each class were organized by class teachers once in an academic year.

An open house programme is conducted every semester to discuss the performance of the students. Remedial coaching is given to the weak students of the college. The class teachers identify the slow-learners of each class and remedial coaching was arranged for them with special focus on SC/ST.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The college gives much importance to research and development aspects. One of the faculties of Botany department is actively engaged in research. Other teachers are planning to apply for major and minor projects

The Chemistry Department is a research department and has set up sufficient infrastructure for research. The research centre of Chemistry Department was officially recognised by the MG University during the academic year 2013-2014. Dr. Jollyamma Mathew, and Dr. Jesty Thomas, got recognition as research guides, by the MG University. Dr. Giable George got research guideship at Bharathiyar University in the year 2014. Currently the department is having three ongoing major projects and three ongoing minor projects funded by UGC, DST and KSCSTE. Four research fellows are working in three different major projects. Two of them are doing Ph.D and the other one has applied for Ph.D registration.

The faculty members of Chemistry have presented several papers in various international and national conferences and have published research papers in different Journals, both international and national. Also, the department is promoting the research attitude of PG and UG students by giving awareness and guidance. As a part of this, they are providing enough opportunities to the students and they are permitted to do some research activities during Saturdays and holidays, by utilising the facilities of research lab. M.Sc students are oriented by the teachers for training at various Laboratories and Firms

The Economics department is recognized as a 'Research Centre' by the M.G. University. Dr. Cyriac Joseph and Dr. A Jose are approved research guides of Mahatma Gandhi University. Ten research scholars are actively pursuing research in the department. The faculty members have undertaken many Minor Research Projects. There are two ongoing Minor Research Projects in the department. Dr. Cyriac Joseph is the chief editor of the interdisciplinary journal "New Numbers and Letters" published by K.E College.

**In the English department, the research aptitudes of the students are instigated by means of various projects and assignments given to the students. Seminars are presented in classes which gives the students an impetus in the field of Research.**

**The teachers are actively involved in publishing papers in reputed journals and in presenting research papers in conferences. The newly appointed faculty is planning on engaging in Doctoral programme.**

**In the History department, research is promoted by undertaking Minor Research projects, attending seminars, paper presentation and paper publications. Altogether got 6 minor projects and completed all the projects. The Department has two Research Guides with their research centre at Assumption College, Changanacherry. Two research scholars are doing Ph.D under the guidance of the teachers of the department.**

**In the Mathematics department, Mrs. Stancy V Sebastain of the department has registered as a Ph. D. student under the guidance of Dr. Sunny Joseph in Bharathiyar University**

**In the Physics department, faculty members actively participate in various research activities. At present the department is undertaking one major project and two minor projects. Dr. Jaiby Joseph have research collaboration with Indian Neutrino Observatory (INO) which will lead to major research opportunities for both faculty and students. Research oriented projects are given to P.G students to get them introduced to the field of research.**

**In the Zoology department, one of the faculty members is a Ph.D holder and two others are pursuing research. For promoting the research aptitude of the students they are encouraged to explore their surroundings and do collections. The Department also arranged an invited lecture of Dr. Abraham Samuel, Associate Professor CMS College, Kottayam, who conducts research on Dragon flies.**

**Faculties of the commerce department actively participate in various research activities and paper presentations. At present the department is undertaking three minor projects. Two teachers are pursuing research in the department.**

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

**The various science departments maintain well equipped labs with an array of sophisticated project/practical related instruments required for the academic programme. The students are given training sessions for familiarising with the operation of these**

instruments. The students are also given access to these instruments while doing their study projects. All departments have sufficient number of computers and LCDs.

The Commerce department has got a computer lab fully equipped, providing services to the students in various practical aspects such as computerized accounting, IT for business, etc.

In each department, one or more computers with internet facility are setup for the use of students for their curricular/co-curricular activities.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

In each department there is an association and the association activities help in inculcating leadership qualities in students, and also promote their extracurricular talents.

The chemistry department is promoting UGC-CSIR NET and SET Coaching, and Remedial coaching for their students. The brighter students of various batches are given remedial classes to weaker students for Mathematics and Physics.

##### Economics

In the Economics departments, students are encouraged to appear for various competitive examinations. Special coaching is provided to the students for appearing for various examinations. Students of the association participated in a number of intercollegiate events held at various places and bagged many prizes.

In the English department, the best of talents of the students are showcased in every activity of the college as well as the department which acts as a boost to all in the department. The faculty of English also engages in helping the students of the entire college with various language related and other activities.

The Zoology Association of the department is giving ample opportunities for the students to improve their leadership qualities as well as management skills. The Association is headed by a secretary and joint secretary as elected representatives and an executive committee consisting of nominated students from I,II &III year degree classes. Under the auspices of the Association various competitions are held to nurture the skills and talents of our students

Career orientation classes are conducted for both P.G and UG students of the Physics department. NET/SET/GATE coaching is conducted for PG students after their regular

college hours. Care is taken to ensure that students are recruited by various firms through campus placements

The commerce department is providing career guidance classes to all the students. The department with experienced faculty could offer quality education. The Commerce Association conducts various programmes including commerce fest – Colligo – which helps students to acquire leadership qualities. Students also participate in various fests organised by other colleges.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Faculty and staff recruitment is done by the management in accordance with the government provisions.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Various departments of the College collaborate with different institutions for promoting learning and social commitment.

The department of Botany has collaboration with college of pharmacy, medical college Kottayam. Department has collaboration with the post graduate and research department of Botany, S H College, Thevara.


