The CMI Congregation is a religious and charitable order of the catholic religious minority community, coming under the purview of the Constitution of India. This congregation is the embodiment of the dream and vision of Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara whose eminence as an educational and social reformer was duly recognized and honoured by the Government of India by the release in 1986 of a postal stamp with his image. The CMI Congregation with more than 2000 members renders service to the community in diverse areas like education, health care, social and cultural activities, charitable service etc. K E College is one of the more than five hundred educational institutions run by the CMI Congregation in various parts of India.



5. CMI Educational Policy

8. A Brief History of the College

Kuriakose Elias College was established and is administered by St. Joseph's Monastery, Mannanam, the Mother House of the CMI Congregation. The College is built on the same beautiful hill where in 1846, Saint Kuriakose Elias took the first step towards secular education by starting the "Sanskrit School". It was here in Mannanam that the first press of the Catholic Church in India (third in the state of Kerala) came up. This was also the place which saw the publication of the first Malayalam daily (Nazrani Deepika) in 1887. The first English medium school of the Catholics in Kerala was started here in 1881. St. Ephrem's High School, one of the first high schools in Kerala came up here in Mannanam, in 1885. Mannanam thus has made solid contributions to the cultural, educational and spiritual spheres right from the inception of the CMI congregation in 1831.

K E College was established in 1964 as a Junior College to give the catholic youth the benefits of higher education through a congenial catholic environment. The college fulfills this aim, working hand in hand with the Government and University and giving due respect to the rights of the minorities guaranteed by the Constitution of India. Rev. Fr. Fabian CMI, the Prior of St. Joseph's Monastery was the Founder Manager and inspirational force behind the construction of the college building. Rev. Fr. Papias CMI was the first Principal of the college. The college was affiliated to Kerala University and upgraded as a Degree college in 1967. Since 1983, the college has been under the jurisdiction of Mahatma Gandhi University. In the short span of fifty three years, the college has become a great centre of learning and a source of inspiration to the people of Kerala.

9. Aims and Objectives

The Congregation of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate undertakes educational apostolate, based on the love of God and service to mankind as modeled in Jesus Christ, against the background of Indian heritage so as to produce intellectually competent, morally upright, socially committed and spiritually inspired men and women of India. In pursuance of the above general objective of education, the college has been redefining its objectives from time to time. Today the college stands for the following objectives.



- ◆ To create a just and humane society where dignity of the human person is respected, where unjust social structures are challenged, where our cultural heritage of Ahimsa, Religious Harmony and National Integration are upheld and where the poor and the marginalized are specially taken care of.
- ◆ To form leaders who are intellectually competent, spiritually mature, morally upright, psychologically integrated, physically healthy and socially acceptable, who will champion the cause of justice, love and peace.
- ◆ To promote the acquisition of scholarship and communicative skills by involving the students in research oriented projects and co-curricular activities.
- ◆ To prepare the youth of the 21st century by promoting international brotherhood, environmental consciousness, gender justice and the sense of humanity.

For the accomplishment of the above goals, the college is putting in special efforts to enable the students to strive for excellence in every field, to seek and apply knowledge to find solutions to various social problems, to value and use their freedom with responsibility, to be clear and firm on principles and values and to be selfless in rendering services, through a team of teachers who are active, dedicated, competent and humane in dealings.

10. Management

The College is managed by the St. Joseph's Monastery, Mannanam, the Mother House of CMI Congregation and comes under the purview of the Chapter and the Education Committee of the Monastery. The Prior of St. Joseph's Monastery is the Manager. The general management of the college is vested in the Managing Board whose Ex-Officio President is the Manager. Other members are appointed by the Manager in accordance with the bye-law of the Managing Board.

11. K E College Emblem

The College coar of arms is a shield shaped with a crown having a small cross at the top and a scroll at the bottom. The scroll proclaims the motto 'Thamasoma Jyothirgamaya'. The rising sun at the centre of the emblem beams the perpetual light of glory on the palm filled landscape revealing the beauty and sanctity of the rural setting in which the college is situated. The boat with the boatman symbolizes one's sense of duty, and the lotus, his purity of heart. The lighted lamp emphasizes one's quest for knowledge and the open book, the seat of knowledge. The flowering plant visualizes the totality of man's aspirations, his growth and success. The golden crown and cross on top of the emblem represent God Almighty showering His love and blessings on all, and remind us "no crown without cross".



III. COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. DISCIPLINE

A. The Principal is the ultimate disciplinary authority in the college. Students should strictly follow the disciplinary rules of the college. A student is not expected to plead that he/she is not aware of the existence of such rules. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. Students are to read the college notice board daily. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/herself with decency and decorum. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including suspension, or dismissal.

B. Outsiders not Permitted

- 1. Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the members of the staff or students on the college campus without the permission of the HOD and Principal.
- 2. Students shall not bring any press reporters and media persons to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the HOD/Principal.
- 3. Only parents/guardians are permitted.

C. Mobile Phones Banned

The use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited on the college campus as per Government order G.O. No.11. Offenders will be levied with fine and the mobile phones confiscated.

D. Character and Conduct

Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by a student's good conduct and behaviour. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter, and will not be based on any recommendation. The following are the rules and regulations.

- 1. Political activities on the part of students and the members of staff are strictly forbidden on the college campus.
- 2. Any meeting of the faculty, staff or students on the college campus shall be arranged only with the explicit permission of the college authorities.

- 3. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the Principal is entitled to refuse admission to an applicant, to suspend, dismiss or take any other punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct.
- 4. Misconduct shall include:
 - a. Staying away from classes without sufficient reason.
 - b. Disrespectful behaviour towards the members of the staff.
 - c. Provoking students to strike and participate in strike, dharna etc. in the college.
 - d. Loitering in and around the main gate, porch, stairs and the verandas during freehours and creating disturbance to the classes in progress. (During free hours the students are expected to make use of the library or go to the retiring rooms.)
 - e. Disorderly behaviour in the class.
 - f. Organizing tours without the permission of the Principal
 - g. Organizing meetings in the college or displaying notices on the college notice board without the permission of the Principal.
 - h. Distributing leaflets, hand-bills or other materials and displaying banners and posters inside the campus.
 - Scribbling offensive, abusive or obscene words or drawing figures on black boards or any kind of writings on the walls or other places in the college or on the Campus.
- 5. Smoking, consumption of alcoholic beverages and use of narcotic drugs are strictly prohibited. Criminal proceedings will be taken against those found under the influence of alcohol or narcotic drugs within the campus.
- 6. Vandalism and destruction of college property will be severely dealt with and the material loss will be fully recovered with fine.
- 7. When the students meet a member of the staff within the campus or outside, they will greet him/her as a mark of respect.
- 8. Students are expected to keep decency and decorum in their dress and behaviour. Pictures and writings of any sort shall not be exhibited on the dress.



- 9. These rules are liable to be amended when found necessary.
- 10. The teachers shall be present in the class before the third bell states that they may give good example to the students by participating in prayer.
- 11. Teachers shall be responsible for maintaining discipline in classes
- 12. It is the duty of the students and the staff to get informed of all the rules and notifications of the college from time to time. Ignorance of these rules is not condoned.

E. Mandatory Dress Code

There is no prescribed uniform for the aided students. Students should wear decent dresses, preferably saree or churidar by girl students and pants/dhoti and shirt by boys. Showy clothes, like low waisted trousers, T-shirts without collars and with colour prints, and caps are strictly prohibited. Boys shall not tuck up their dhoti while they are on the campus.

Self financing students have uniform. Thy have to wear uniform on specifide days.

F. Identity Card Compulsory

Students should wear at all times college identification cards which should be shown to the authorities and to the watchman when demanded. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc. and entry into class rooms, examination halls, library, auditorium, laboratories, open air auditorium will be made only on production of the Identity Card. The Identity Card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificates, whichever is earlier. Class teachers may see to it that students comply with this.

G. Religious and Moral Instructions

All catholic students are to attend the Holy Mass in the College Chapel on the first Friday of every month. Non Catholic students must compulsory attend the moral classes to be held simultaneously in the college auditorium.

H. Cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted on the campus.

I. Ragging: A Serious Criminal Offence

Students shall not indulge in ragging or in any other activities causing harassment or difficulties to the fellow students in the college. Any student involving in ragging activities will have to face penal proceedings in accordance with the provisions in the Ragging Prohibition Act of the Govt. of Kerala.

2. GUIDELINES TO PREVENT SEXUAL HARASSMENT AGAINST WOMEN IN THE COLLEGE-POLICY AND PROCEDURE

- 1. The girl students enjoy equal rights and status with boys in the college.
- 2. To protect the necessary privacy of girl students, a separate waiting room cum lunch hall with sufficient toilet facility is provided in the college. A quadrangle specifically for girls is provided in the campus and a separate room is provided for girls in the college canteen.
- 3. Male students are not permitted to the areas specified exclusively for girls.
- 4. Sexual harassment of any sort shall not be tolerated. The sexual harassment is defined as the request for sexual favours and other verbal (including written and electronic communications) or physical contact of a sexual nature.
- 5. The Management, the Principal and the teaching staff should interact with girl students and take them into confidence by apprising them of their rights and safety in the college.
- 6. The institution has constituted a discipline committee consisting of senior faculty members to (a) keep a continuous watch and vigil against any violation of the guidelines and (b) to promptly deal with incidents of violation of the guidelines.
- 7. Any violation of the guidelines for the protection of girls shall be reported to the Principal or the discipline committee. The relevant telephone numbers are available in the college hand-book.
- 8. If any violation of the guidelines is observed, the discipline committee after proper enquiry, will report the matter to the Principal.
- The name of the offenders will be published on the notice board.
 Disciplinary action including expulsion, suspension, imposition of fines and public apology may be meted out to the offender.
- 10. These guidelines are published in the college hand book as per the instruction from the UGC and are always guided by the best of intention and correctional attitude.



3. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- 1. A working day is divided into two sessions: the forenoon session (FN) of three periods and the afternoon session (AN) of two periods.
- 2. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period by the member of the teaching staff in charge of the class.
- Students shall occupy their respective seats before attendance is taken. Late comers should not enter the class room, nor should any student leave the class room, without the permission of the member of the teaching staff in charge of the class.
- 4. Late-comers may be refused attendance for the period or marked late at the discretion of the lecturer concerned.
- 5. Those students going for sports, games, competitions or official purposes of the union activities etc. should apply for prior permission from the Principal on the prescribed form, countersigned by the Head of the Department or teacher concerned in order to be eligible for leave. Non-compliance will be considered absence from class.
- 6. The Semester wise Certificate of attendance and Progress required by the University for promotion or for admission to the University Examination will, in no case be granted unless (1) a student has attended not less than three fourths of the number of working days for his/her course during the academic year, and (2) the Principal is satisfied that the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
- 7. No student shall absent himself/herself from class without leave. Application for leave of absence should be made to the Principal, through the class teacher, in the prescribed form not later than the first date of return to the college after the absence.
- 8. Every application for leave shall be countersigned by the Parent or Guardian as the case may be. Incomplete application will be rejected.
- When leave is required in case of illness, for more than three consecutive working days, application for the same must be supported by a Medical Certificate.
- 10. If absent without leave for one period, a student will lose attendance for the whole session. When the total days of absence in a Semester exceed five, the parent/ guardian of the student shall meet the

Principal and give satisfactory explanation. This has to be followed for every five days of absence.

- 11. A student absenting himself/herself without leave for more than ten consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the roll, and he/she may be readmitted only on payment of the admission fee of Rs. 2/- and the College fee dues, if any.
- 12. Absence without leave from any terminal or class examination or from a composition or practical work will be taken seriously.
- 13. Students should get 75% of attendance in a semester and the deficiency will be condoned only when the University Syndicate is satisfied that the absence was for reasons beyond the control of the student. Deficiency beyond 10 days will, on no account, be condoned and exemption will not be granted for more than two semesters in any course of study.
- 14. With regard to the staff members, application for leave has to be submitted before taking leave in the prescribed form with necessary endorsement as the case may be.

4. PAYMENT OF FEES

- 1. Fees are to be paid in three equal instalments (or in one lot for the full year). Special fees will be collected along with the first instalment.
- 2. If a student fails to pay the fee on the due date, he/she shall pay a fine of Rs. 5/- along with the fee on or before the 10th day after the due date; if the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be considered as the 10th day.
- 3. If the fees and fines of a term (an instalment) are not paid before the last opportunity given for payment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be readmitted, he / she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also remit all arrears of fees with fine. No readmission fee will be realised in such cases of readmission. The readmitted student will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of readmission.



- 4. If the Fee Payment Date happens to be a holiday, the fee should be remitted on the next Working Day.
- 5. If a student studying in an Arts or Science College leaves with a T.C. and is admitted to another similar college, he/she shall pay the fees for the term only in one college. He/she should produce the receipts and certificate of remittance obtained from the college which he/she has left, at the college where he/she is admitted. However, special fees and caution deposit will have to be paid again at the new college. The above mentioned provisions are applicable in the case of this college, with regard to Inter College transfer.
- 6. Absence with or without leave from the College shall not be an excuse for non-payment of fees at the proper date.
- 7. No part payment will be accepted. Remember, the fees are to remitted at the Government Treasury on the prescribed date.
- 8. Students who are admitted for a term for making up shortage of attendance for the course which the student was undergoing, should pay one third of the tuition fees for the year together with full fees and caution deposit at the time of admission. Only the former students of this college will be admitted as term students.
- 9. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are bonafide subjects of Kerala State are eligible for full fee concession and stipend. They will have to produce a certificate of nativity and community from a revenue officer not below the rank of a Thahsildar.
- 10 On the days fixed for the payment of fees for a particular class, fees from other classes will not be accepted.
- 11. All cash transactions will be closed in the office at 2.00 p.m.

Caution Deposit

- Caution Deposit after deduction of dues, if any, will be refunded on the completion of the course of study or when the student leaves the college with a Transfer Certificate.
- It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of his/ her caution deposit in time.



- Claim for refund of caution deposit should be made before the opening of the college after the completion of the course. Amounts that remain unclaimed after two months from the date of the course completion will be forfeited.
- 4. The students should keep in safe custody the receipts issued for remittance of the caution deposit and it should be produced along with the application for refund of the caution deposit. Failure to produce the original receipt is forfeiture of the claim for the refund.

5. COLLEGE LIBRARY RULES

1. All students are members of the College Library.

2. The Library timings are as under:

Class Days:

periodicals and Reference section: 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Selection and issue of Books: 12.30 p.m. to 2.00 p.m. (lending section)

Return of Books: 9.30 a.m to 1.30 p.m.

Non-class Days:

Periodicals and Reference section: 9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.

Issue and Return of Books: 10.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon

Library will be closed by 4.00 p.m on Saturdays

- 3. Silence must be strictly observed in the library.
- 4. Students may freely select books from the shelves. But they should be careful in replacing the books so that the books are not misplaced. In case of any difficulty, the books may be laid flat on the shelves. Please remember misplaced books cannot be easily traced out.
- 5. Students are allowed to take only one note book into the library. Other books, umbrellas and other personal belongings should be kept in the shelves for personal effects at the entrance.
- 6. Students will be permitted to take two books on loan at a time. Books in the Reference Section will not be lent out.
- 7. Students will be responsible for any damage caused to books. Pencil marks, ink-stain, etc. made in a book will be treated as damage. When a book is issued to a student, he/she may point out to the librarian or his assistants any damage/defect noted concerning a book; otherwise it will be presumed that the book was intact when it was issued.
- 8. If a book is damaged or lost by a student he/she will have to replace it or pay its current price and postage. Out-of-print books may be charged higher rates.
- 9. The period of loan is 14 days. Books may be re-issued for a further period of 14 days if there is no other demand for them. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for delay in the return of books. The librarian may recall any book at any time even before the due date.



- 10. Failure to return book on the due date entails a student to pay a fine of Rs.1.00 per day of delay except for intervening Sundays and public holidays.
- 11. Each student will be issued two Reader's Tickets. Books can be borrowed against them. Students must ensure that they get back their reader's tickets when they return the books. A sum of R_S. 5.00 will be charged for the loss of each Reader's Ticket. This does not, however, absolve the holder from the responsibility for books borrowed against tickets lost. Duplicates may be issued 15 days after the report of the loss.
- 12. Students are required to return all Library books before 31 March every year. Final year students shall return their tickets also by that date. Defaulters will be charged the cost of books and a fine of Rs.1.00 per day per item for the entire period of delay.
- 13. Students shall not exchange books borrowed from the library.
- 14. Students coming to the library, should show if demanded, their Identity Cards to the staff. Without Identity Cards library service may be refused to them.
- 15. As our library is fully computerised, students have to swipe their ID cards at the entry point, if they are to enter the library.

6. ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

- A student who has paid all dues to the College is entitled to a
 Transfer Certificate (T.C.) at the end of an academic year or when
 he/she leaves the college for better courses of study, and if the
 progress and conduct are good or satisfactory, as stipulated by
 University regulations.
- 2. A student past or present, desiring to obtain a certificate (Transfer, Course & Conduct, Age, Marks, and Identification etc.) shall apply to the Principal in writting stating the year of study and the class number.
- 3. In case a student is expelled from the college for serious misconduct or repeated misbehaviour, his/her T.C. will be sent to the Registrar of the University and the matter will be reported to his/her parent or guardian.



- 4. Every student should collect his/her T.C. at the end of his/her course and produce it when admitted to the next course. T. C. will be issued only against the surrender of the identity card.
- 5. Conduct Certificate is a document which a student has to earn. It is not issued as a matter of right. Conduct Certificate is issued on the basis of an over-all evaluation by the teachers concerned

7. INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS & EVALUATION

- 1. There will be internal examinations in each semester.
- 2. 20% of the grade/mark will be awarded by the respective department, regarding a student's academic progress and this will be incorporated in the final mark/grade sheet issued by the University.
- After each examination, parents will be asked to come to the department concerned, when informed and enquire of their ward's progress.
- 4. Students are not allowed to absent themselves from exams, test papers, seminars and internal assignments.

Internal Evaluation

The restructured curriculam for Degree and P. G. Courses in M. G. University has incorporated internal assessment as an effective measure for fruitful evaluation of students. The performance of every student in the campus, in addition to the evaluation through Internal Examinations, will be assessed in each semester by his/her teachers in accordance with the norms issued by the University. The marks awarded to the students in the internal assessment will be forwarded to the University for inclusion in the final Mark Sheet.

25% of evaluation is earmarked for Internal Evaluation of each PG, course and 20% for each UG course.

Students who have not secured 75% attendance are not eligible to register for the University Examinations and will not be promoted to the next semester.

8. GRIEVANCES REDRESSAL MECHANISM

A Grievances Redressal cell functions in the college, in order to settle the grievances of students. It is a three tier system which functions in the following way.

Any matter of complaint/act of indiscipline of a student, shall be first brought to the notice of the class teacher concerned and if the student/complainant is denied justice, he/she shall approach the HOD. If justice is denied there also, the matter shall be brought to the notice of the Principal and settled by him.

9. EXCURSION AND STUDY TOURS

Excursion and Study Tours by students are permitted as part of the curricular and co-curricular programme, under the following stipulations.



- 1. Only final year students are allowed to organise study tour/excursions.
- 2. This should be done only with the prior permission of the class teacher, Head of the Dept. concerned and the Principal. Students are to obtain letters of consent from their parent/s
- 3. Booking of vehicles and arrangements for stay while on tour should be made only after consultation with the concerned authorities.
- 4. Class Teacher(s) or other teachers deputed by the respective Head of the Dept. should accompany the students.
- 5. The maximum number of days for a tour shall be four. However, for Zoology, Botany and Chemistry students, the number of days shall be fixed by the respective departments.
- 6. Any act of indiscipline while on tour shall be considered an act of indiscipline committed on the campus and will attract punitive action.
- 7. As far as possible, study tours shall be conducted during November/ December soon after the semester examinations.
- 8. Each member of the touring party should see that his / her conduct enhances the prestige and reputation of the institution.

IV. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. CAMPUS MINISTRY

This service aims at the spiritual and moral development of the staff and students of the college. The Campus Ministry renders the following services:-

a) Students' Annual Retreat and Value Education Seminar

A retreat is arranged annually for all the Christian students of the college. Similarly a value educaton seminar is arranged for the non-Christian students.

b) Staff Orientation Programme

An Orientation Course is conducted annually for the faculty and the support staff to motivate them for the effective implementation of the goals and objectives of the institution.

c) C. S. M.

All the Catholic students of the college shall be members of the



Catholic Students' Movement. Catholic members of the faculty shall be honorary members. C. S. M. organises various programmes to inculcate spiritual and moral values in the members-- Holy Mass on every First Friday for all catholic students and orientation programme for all other students, annual retreat / seminar for the staff and students, prayer meeetings etc.

d) Vincent De Paul Society

A unit of the worldwide organisation St. Vincent De Paul Society is functioning in our college with the motto 'Service to God through the service to all neighbours'. The unit accepts generous contributions from all members of the college as well as the public and uses them for supporting financially weak students and the public.

e) Counselling Centre

This Centre aims at the integral development of the students. Counselling helps the students:-

- a) to become aware of his/her personal problems/strengths/ weaknesses etc.
- b) to enable them to make appropriate decisions for his/her betterment.
- c) to enable them to use their psychic energy creatively
- d) to help him/her develop will-power.

2. TALENT CLUBS

Various talent clubs are functioning in the College in order to foster inborn talents of the students. Hence the students are advised to join them according to their tastes.

3. SERVICE FORUMS

a) National Cadet Corps (ARMY & NAVY)

N.C.C. aims at kindling in students a spirit of discipline and willingness to serve the country. Students can get themselves enrolled in the beginning of each academic year.

The cadets are given regular training in the college and in camps organized outside. Examinations are conducted and merit certificates awarded. Uniforms and refreshments are supplied free of cost.



b) National Service Scheme (N. S. S.)

N.S.S. is a voluntary association of students, coming under the management of Human Resource Dept., Govt. of India, to promote discipline, leadership, national integration, religious harmony, work culture, respect for labour and Gandhian principles and to channelise the energy and enthusiasm of the youth in productive endeavours. Those who successfully complete the training under the scheme will be awarded certificates and are eligible for grace marks for higher studies.

c) Women's Forum/Anti-Harassment Cell

Women's Forum is an association of women students of the college providing opportunities for developing their talents, conscientisation of their equal rights and responsibilities in building up the society.

d) SC/ST Cell & Equal Opportunity Cell

This cell monitors various schemes of the University and Government for the welfare of the SC/ST students, and a body functions in the college.

e) Blood Donors' Forum

The members of the forum are carrying on the work of the 'Good Samaritan' by donating blood. All the members of the Elian Family can join this forum and express solidarity with the suffering humanity. This forum functions under the college National Service Scheme.

f) Red Cross Society

A branch of the Red Cross Society is functioning in the college. Its humanitarian activities are coordinated by the NSS unit of the College.

4. WELFARE ASSOCIATIONS

a) College Canteen

A College Canteen is run on contract basis within the campus. In order to ensure quality of service, a Canteen Committee consisting of teachers, non-teaching staff and student representatives monitors its functioning.



b) K. E. College Co-operative Society Ltd No. K - 621, Mannanam

Text books, note books, record books, stationery etc. are supplied to staff and students at 5% discount from the store functioning inside the campus. Students are given Associate Memberships at the time of admission. They are advised to support the store by making all their purchase from the store itself.

c) Staff Co-operative Credit Society

A Co-operative Staff Credit Society functions in the college for the welfare of the staff of the college. All the permanent members of the teaching and non-teaching staff are eligible for membership in the society. The society provides facilities for deposit and loans of various kinds.

d) Teachers' Welfare Fund

In addition to the Co-op.Credit Society, a teacher's welfare Association also functions with membership for teachers who are permanently appointed.

e) Medical Inspection Wing

All students on the rolls of the college are medically inspected by a Medical Officer on dates fixed by the Principal.

5. PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

Every parent/guardian of a student on rolls becomes a member of the association by paying a prescribed membership fee. The association takes special interest in the development of the college and renders every possible help to the management and teachers for the smooth running of the college.

The eligible students should get counter signature on the application from the Fisheries Officer before it is submitted to the college office. 



Honorable High Court judgement in case No. 1806 of 2017 dtd 19-10-2017 filed by Kuriakose Elias College, Mannanam

Educational Institutions cannot be turned into a political battle ground. In an educational institution, there cannot be politics. Any individual student interested in politics is free to indulge in his interest, but outside the educational institution. These institutions are teaching and learning institutions. The police would be duty bound to give all assistance in the matter so that upon timely interventions, the Dharanas and vandalism is put under control. Political activities like Dharanas, hunger strikes and other practices like satyagraha have no place in a constitutional democracy, much less in academic institutions. Anyone indulging in the said activities in an educational institution would make himself liable to be expelled and /or rusticated. Educational institutions are meant for imparting education and not politics.

The police should ensure that the orders of this court are not violated and the academic atmospheres in educational institutions are not disturbed. The educational institution cannot be hijacked and be permitted to turn into a political battle field.
